

On Friday, the President issued four Executive Orders aimed at reducing prescription drug prices, including:

- Executive Order on Lowering Prices for Patients
 by Eliminating Kickbacks to Middlemen
- ✓ Executive Order on Increasing Drug Importation to Lower Prices for American Patients
- ✓ Executive Order on Access to Affordable Lifesaving Medications
- ✓ Executive Order to Establish International Price Index (Not released at this time)

Joint Pharmacy DIR Letter to HHS: Pharmacy DIR Fee Reform Inclusion with Administration **Executive Order**

Urges the Administration to address DIR fees in the implementation of the Executive Order calling for the elimination of kickbacks to middlemen.

Re: Pharmacy DIR Fee Reform Inclusion with Administration Executive Order

Dear Secretary Azar:

Our organizations write to reiterate the urgent need to include a provision to address pharmacy direct and indirect remuneration (DIR) fees as you work to implement the Executive Order on Lowering Prices for Patients by Eliminating Kickbacks to Middlemen, more commonly discussed

Again, we remind the Administration of the continuous and heightened impact of pharmacy DIR fees imposed by Medicare Part D plan sponsors and their pharmacy benefit managers (PBMs) on our members. Pharmacy DIR fees are growing beyond CMS' projection of 10% year-over-year. This growth of pharmacy DIR fees is especially unsustainable during the current COVID-19 PHE when our members, representing every aspect of the pharmacy industry, care for patients, while also providing desperately needed access to COVID-19 tests and related services.

As the Administration continues to work towards the goal of reducing the costs of drugs for the consumer, we request you consider the current situation where pharmacies are under immense and unfair financial pressure and patients pay higher out-of-pocket costs for medications they need without benefiting from lower prices at the pharmacy counter.

As the EO calls for the HHS Secretary to complete the rulemaking process already commenced, our organizations can only support such a systemic change if any final rule also directly addresses and fixes pharmacy DIR fees. The system contemplated by the rebate rule cannot go into effect without, at a minimum, ensuring that retroactive pharmacy DIR fees are eliminated, therefore without, at a minimum, ensuring that reconstruct photocological produced cost sharing over 10 years.





Pharmacy Models for COVID-19 Testing



As the response to the COVID-19 pandemic continues to unfold, pharmacists and pharmacies across the country are mobilizing to support their communities through COVID-19 testing. Pharmacy testing models have emerged due to the ongoing effort to expand access to testing. This guide will provide an overview of two common models and the payment mechanisms associated at this time. This resource outlines a stepwise approach to COVID-19 testing and payment.

Pharmacy Testing Model #1: Specimen Collection in Partnership with a Laboratory

In this model, the pharmacy partners with a CLIA high or moderate complexity laboratory.



Pharmacy Testing Model #2: Point-of-Care Testing

In this model, the pharmacist conducts the COVID-19 test at point of care using a test authorized by the FDA under an EUA for patient care settings.
