his selection of APhA convention badges T features those worn by meeting registrants from 1879 to 1940*. The name of the attendee did not appear on the badge until the 1920s. Before then, it was considered improper for individuals to wear badges displaying their name. Badges often included a registration number instead of the person's name. The attendees were provided with booklets containing the names of attendees and their corresponding registration number. The last badge shown here is from 1940. Beginning in the early 1940's, badges consisted of less imaginative name tags encased in celluloid holders, often provided by a convention bureau. PHARMACEUTICAL



Indianapolis, Indiania

Earliest known badge was attractive ribbon with membership logo and site of the meeting.





August 23-25, 1881

Kansas City, Missouri Ribbon inscribed in red letters Kansas City, 1881.



SEPTEMBER 12-15, 1882

Niagara Falls, New YorkCircular badge identifies the Association as A.P.A.



SEPTEMBER 11-13, 1883 Washington, DC Circular badge features the U.S. Capitol. FRONT ROBERT SNEIDER, BACK

August 26-29, 1884

Milwaukee, WisconsinCircular badge displays the first APhA logo.

SEPTEMBER 8-10, 1885

Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania

Flying eagle tops this ribbon, which does not bear year or host city.



September 5-9, 1887

Cincinnati, Ohio

Medal shows balance, retort, mortar and pestle, and inscription greeting the Association to Cincinnati.



SEPTEMBER 3-7, 1888

Detroit, Michigan

Badge is replica of a ceramic pill tile. Registrant was number 679.

San Francisco, California

Badge features Golden Bear and sailing boat in the bay.



SEPTEMBER 8-12, 1890

Old Point Comfort, Virginia Medal was attached to a ribbon.



JULY 14-18, 1892 Profile House, New Hampshire

Meeting commenced in Boston but moved as group to New Hampshire.



August 14-19, 1893

Chicago, Illinois

Medal with mortar and pestle inscribed World's Fair Meeting.



August 14-21, 1895

Denver, Colorado

This ribbon provides space for registrant's number.



August 12-18, 1896

Montreal, Quebec, Canada Badge features a mortar and pestle superimposed on Canadian maple leaf.



August 23-29, 1897

Lake Minnetonka, MinnesotaBadge includes drug balance and image of Minnihaha
Falls.



August 29 - September 12, 1898

Baltimore, Maryland

Medal features coat of arms. Ribbon pictures the Battle Monument.



SEPTEMBER 4-9, 1899

Put-in-Bay, Ohio

Badge depicts U.S. commander Oliver Hazard Perry in 1813 navigating from Put-in-Bay to engage the British.



May 7-12, 1900

Richmond, Virginia

Medal depicts Pocahontas straddling a Powhatan to protect John Smith.



SEPTEMBER 16-21, 1901

St. Louis, Missouri

Medal shows crest United We Stand, Divided We Fall.



SEPTEMBER 8-15, 1902 Philadelphia, Pennsylvania Badge used for semicentennial meeting. 546

August 3-8, 1903

Mackinac Island, Michigan
Badge pictures panorama of the town including
the Victorian Grand Hotel.



SEPTEMBER 5-10, 1904

Kansas City, MissouriBadge includes a balance, mortar and pestle, and the emblem KC.



SEPTEMBER 4-9, 1905

Atlantic City, New JerseyBadge features a coat of arms for sailing.



SEPTEMBER 3-8, 1906

Indianapolis, Indiana

Medal shows Soldiers and Sailors Monument on a mortar and pestle.



SEPTEMBER 2-7, 1907

New York, New York
Eagle flies above inscription Member with medal below.



SEPTEMBER 7-12, 1908

Hot Springs, Arkansas

Badge pictures entrance to the U.S. Reservation created in 1892 by Congress.



August 16-20, 1909 Los Angeles, California Medal pictures San Gabriel Mission founded in 1771.

May 2-7, 1910

Richmond, Virginia

Medal features APhA logo, graduate, mortar and pestle.



August 19-24, 1912

Denver, Colorado

Medal pictures a beautiful columbine, the state flower.



August 18-23, 1913

Nashville, Tennessee Medal pictures Hermitage, home of Andrew Jackson.



August 24-29, 1914

Detroit, MichiganOnly the ribbon of this badge remains.



August 9-13, 1915

San Francisco, CaliforniaBadge features the San Francisco City Hall.

Indianapolis, Indiana

Badge worn by Eugene G. Eberle, APhA President 1910-1911.




August 12-17, 1918

Badge includes APhA logo in shield introduced in 1912.





May 5-10, 1920 Washington, DC Badge shows top of U.S. Capitol. Worn by Evander F. Kelly, APhA general secretary 1925-1944.

New Orleans, Louisiana Medal shows map pinpointing New Orleans and Panama Canal.



August 14-18, 1922

Cleveland, Ohio
Medal with APhA logo highlights 70th annual convention.



SEPTEMBER 3-8, 1923 Asheville, North Carolina An eagle perches above a modified APhA logo.

August 25-28, 1924

Buffalo, New York

Host city's namesake buffalo portrayed on badge. Worn by Henry M. Whelpley, APhA president 1901-1902.



August 24-29, 1925 Des Moines, Iowa Badge identifies 73rd APhA annual convention.

SEPTEMBER 13-17, 1926

Philadelphia, Pennsylvania Only a ribbon was used.



August 22-26, 1927

St. Louis, Missouri

Badge includes plastic tab inscribed DIAMOND JUBILEE.



August 20-26, 1928

Portland, Maine

Plastic scroll includes images of a pine tree and mortar and pestle.



August 26-31, 1929

Rapid City, South Dakota

Badge pictures Mount Rushmore Memorial. Worn by Mrs. Eugene G. Eberle.



May 5-10, 1930

Baltimore, Maryland

Badge shows APhA headquarters. Medal depicts the Battle Monument.



July 27 - August 1, 1931

Miami, Florida

Medal pictures APhA logo and beach scene with palm trees.



August 22-27, 1932

Toronto, Ontario, Canada Ribbon depicts American and Canadian flags in a mortar.



August 26 - September 3, 1933

Madison, Wisconsin

Medal pictures Wisconsin state capital in Madison.



May 7-12, 1934

Washington, DC

Medal shows the American Institute of Pharmacy, which was dedicated during the 1934 annual meeting.



August 5 - 10, 1935

Portland, Oregon

Mount Hood appears at the top and medal proclaims For You A Rose Grows In Portland.



August 22-27, 1938 Minneapolis, Minnesota The skyline of Minneapolis is featured with APhA logo.

August 24 - 28, 1936

Dallas, Texas


Texas-shaped medal with state seal and mortar and pestle.

APHA CONVENTION LAPEL PINS

1985-To Date

n the earlier years of the Association gold bars, indicating the location and date of the meeting were attached to the membership pin. In addition, an additional bar indicating that the association was "Organized in 1852" could be attached. These bars, or "gold ladder badge," became a record of the meetings attended by the member. The bars were purchased by the member from APhA. Pictured is an example of the lapel pin, with meeting bars from 1884-1925 that was found in the APhA Archives and can be attributed to Pharmacist Henry Milton Whelpley (1861-19426) who was APhA President from 1901-1902.

The current lapel pin tradition, depicting the meeting site and year, began in 1985 and was thought to be initiated as a marketing opportunity for industry support at the APhA Annual Meeting. The pin has become a much sought after "collectable" for those pharmacists wanting to display their support of the annual meeting, much as they did between 1884 and 1925. Some traditions never change!
